3. (Interpretative) Why is it dangerous for the little boy to stand here? (Point to the little boy at the boom of the slide.)

	Adequate response	He will get hurt because the big boy is going to slide down and crash into him; the big boy will come down and knock him over (MUST contain information about the little boy being hit as a result of the big boy sliding down).

4. (Evaluative) Why is the lady angry? (Point to the lady chasing the dog.)

Adequate response		Because her dog ran away and he is not coming back; I think she is angry with her dog because he is not coming when she calls him; she is trying to catch the dog but he is not listening.	
Inadequate response Because the dog is there; maybe her child di		Because the dog is there; maybe her child did something naughty; she is cross.	

5. (Predictive) What is the boy trying to do? (Point to the boy with the kite in the background.)

	Tick	Student's response:	
		Adequate response	He is trying to catch his kite; he is trying to make his kite fly; he is flying his kite.
Inadequate response He's there (points);		Inadequate response	He's there (points); a kite; up in the sky; don't know.

6. (Evaluative) If you were at this playground, which activity would you like to do?
